Concerns have been raised about speeding vehicles in Scaleby Hill. These have been passed onto the relevant authorities and the Traffic Data Unit mentioned in the Police Report will be going into the area soon. If you wish to discuss concerns please speak to one of your Councillors or Highway Authority.

## Police Report

Hello once again, I am PCSO Pete Aiston and I am the community officer responsible for covering the Scaleby area.

Firstly I am pleased to report the Scaleby area has had very little crime in the recent months. But this does not mean we can be complacent. There are still criminals visiting the rural areas looking for things to steal, so don't make it easy for them. When you are securing your homes, you need to look at having a minimum of three things when it comes to security.

- Lights - make sure your sheds/garages are covered by a light. A sensor or dusk till dawn light will be sufficient.
- Locks - good heavy duty locks are worth investing in, especially if you have high value items to store. Make sure the locks are attached to the shed/garage properly.
- Noise - An alarm is essential when it comes to preventing crime. You can buy a decent alarm which makes a lot of noise from most of the local hardware stores. The Police also have a limited supply of shed alarms which you can buy.

We have had complaints from residents in Scaleby regarding speeding vehicles. The 40mph limit has been in place for some time now so there is no excuse for it. I am in the process of arranging a TDU (traffic data unit) to be placed in Scaleby. This device will give us information as to how many vehicles are speeding and what times etc. This information will help us target the area at the right times. If you have any concerns about speeding vehicles, or anything else please don't hesitate to get in touch with me.
